The mission of USD 460 is to ensure that all students reach high district standards; apply skills and knowledge to work through complex, real-life situations; act in responsible ways; and function effectively both with others and independently.

The community as a whole is actively involved in working to achieve this mission and in 2002 passed a \$13.7M bond issue to upgrade all the district's schools.

Hesston High School features a new entrepreneurship class that teaches real world skills through the organization and operation of an innovative business called The Pit Stop. Students are involved in every aspect of the operations of this one-of-a-kind café/coffee house.

EDUCATION

Harvey County's educational institutions provide a wide array of programs, without the problems of crime and congestion often associated with larger metropolitan areas.

The strong support for public schools indicates the commitment of Harvey County communities in providing the best possible future for the youth of the area. The school districts have a reputation for high levels of community support and parent involvement as well as highly qualified teaching staff.

The importance of post-secondary education has resulted in the establishment of three institutions of higher learning in Harvey County

BETHEL COLLEGE

Bethel College, located in North Newton, is a four-year liberal arts college. It is the oldest Mennonite college in North America, founded in 1887 for the advancement of postsecondary education in a Christian community. It is affiliated with Mennonite Church USA. Bethel is a self-governing, independent legal corporation with close ties to its constituent churches and communities.

It is academically recognized as a leading liberal arts college. Bethel offers twenty one majors, six certificates and three pre-professional programs. The full-time enrollment in fall 2007 was 541 students

In the 2007-08 academic year, Bethel students came from 22 states and 19 foreign countries. The school has achieved an impressive record of academic excellence. Social work and nursing programs at Bethel are nationally accredited. Its forensics team has qualified for the American Forensics Association's National Individual Events Tournament every year since its beginning in 1978. In 2007 Bethel was recognized by *U. S. News & World Report* as the highest ranked national liberal arts college in Kansas. In 1996, 2003 and 2007, the Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI) has recognized Bethel College for the high number of its science majors who go on to earn M.D. degrees and/or Ph. D. degrees in the sciences. Bethel is also one of only seven Kansas Colleges, and one of only two private liberal arts institutions in the state, to be recognized as part of the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll.

The 9-to-1 student-to-faculty ratio at Bethel ensures a high degree of personal attention for students. Approximately eighty percent of the tenured faculty has their doctorate or its equivalent and 50 percent have overseas experience in teaching, studying or working in voluntary service.

HESSTON COLLEGE

Hesston College was established in 1909 by the Mennonite Church now known as the Mennonite Church USA. It is a two year coeducational, traditional liberal arts school which stresses broadly based liberal studies in 40 major areas which fully prepares students for transfer. It has integrated the curriculum to include seven "career tracks" which prepare students for their profession in two years. The full-time equivalent enrollment in the Fall of 2006 was 462 students.

Hesston College offers all the advantages of two-year schools including the earning of an associate degree and the fact that students are taught by professors, not graduate students or teaching assistants. More than 60 percent of the graduates go on to earn their bachelor's degrees. There is a 10 to 1 student-faculty ratio at Hesston.

Hesston College's nationally renowned aviation program draws students from all over the country. Aviation career programs include flight instruction, charter or business, and commercial airline flying for experienced pilots. Hesston College's highly trained, professional flight instructors offer expert flight training coupled with hands-on aircraft maintenance instruction to provide students an excellent, well-rounded background for a future career in aviation.

HUTCHINSON COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Hutchinson Community College (HCC) in Hutchinson is a public, two-year college with an enrollment of 4,500 students. HCC provides academic excellence to meet the educational needs of the people in its service area. HCC offers courses to prepare students for transfer to four-year institutions. The school also offers skills needed for students to take advantage of career opportunities in industry or business after two-year or nine-month programs. Areas of focus included in HCC's two-year Associate of Applied Science Degree programs are machine technology, manufacturing engineering technology, electronic engineering technology, and data processing. Among the nine-month certificates available are bookkeeping, machine shop technology, and welding technology. Transfer programs include engineering, data processing, and accounting.

HCC offers courses at a number of neighboring communities including several locations in Harvey County, making the curriculum easily accessible to a large number of people. HCC began offering daytime and evening classes at their new location at the Newton Train Station in the fall of 1998. HCC also offers a full range of evening classes at Newton High School and vocational programs at Brooks Trade Center.

SURROUNDING AREA
